

Reasearch questions (1)

Questions

- 1. What is the Impulsclass?
- 2. What are the first results of the Impulsclass?
- 3. Improvement of the method (pilots of the Impulsclass)

Focus:

- Relationships between child, parents and teachers
 - Educational partnerschip (Smit, Sluiter & Driessen, 2006)
- Attititude and behaviour (towards schoolwork) of the child

Method

Participants:

2 pilot Impulsclasses (Leiden, Breda), 4 involved schools

12 parents and children

Instruments:

Questionnaires: CBSK, CBCL, TRF (for child, parent and teacher)

Observations: 4

Semi-structured interviews


- Parents (n=4)
- Teachers (n=4)
- Teachers of the Impulsclass (n=4)

- Special class one morning a week
 - Worktime, circle time & energizers
- 2 Impulssclass teachers
- Each child has 3 or 4 personal goals
- 12 weeks in total
- At least one parent every week



Theoretical Backgrounds:

- Solution focused approach (de Shazer & Berg)
- Family therapeutic approach
- System therapy

Which children attend the Impulsclass?

- Problems with their attitude towards schoolwork concentration, sitting still, listening to orders and instructions
- Mostly boys
- Background in behavioural problems/disorders (ADHD, Autisme, ODD).
- Children from divorced parents
- Age: 8 13

Results Question 2: What are the first results of the Impulsclass?

Child:

- Ability to ignore other distracting children
- Gain in confidence & motivation
- Better focus
- Sometimes better grades
- Responsability of own behaviour

Parents:

- Better understanding of childs behaviour in the classroom
- Better ideas of how to deal with the childs behaviour at home
- Feeling of being understood
- Regained positive view of their child & school

Teachers:

- Better understanding of how to deal with the child in the classroom
- Better communication with parents
- Regained positive view of the child



Results Question 3: Improvement of the Impulsclass

· Not all teacher fill in the scoring goal card



- · Some goals for the children were not concrete enough or some are to concrete
- Teachers would like to hear more about:
 - · What is discussed between Impulsclass teachers and parents
 - How the Impulsclassteachers reflect with the children on their goals.
- How do we sustain the effects after the 12 weeks?

Conclusions for inclusive education

Conclusions for inclusive education

- Impulsclass is a promising concept for challenges the Dutch face in providing inclusive education
- Being a Impulsclass teacher is not for all teachers. Experience and knowledge about special educational needs is required.
- More research should be done to get more sight on long term benefits of Impulsclass



Conclusions for teacher education programs

Conclusions for teacher education programs

- Make students aware of these innovative programs
- Work on the teachers vision of the educational ability of the parents (Cutler, 2000; Epstein, 1987; Henderson, 1988 & Smit, Sluiter & Driessen, 2006).
- The solution focused approach and high level of parental involvement is appreciated in the field....
- and should be taught in schools and teacher education programs
- More dialogue between teachers and parents is needed (Senge, 1995; Isaacs, 1999)
